- iii. Addressing allergies and inclusion pizza for allergy kids caveat at bottom of order form that if child has a dietary restriction to contact PAC via email to discuss options. It is a busy time and difficult to manage easy for me to identify the 3 kids but if we have 2+pizza's worth of kids, this creates some difficulty
- iv. If ordering pizza each hot lunch, we just need someone to take this on volunteers?

f. T-shirts/bags fundraising

8. Principal's Report: Margie

a. Communication Student Learning:

- Ministry has begun a pilot (this year) draft of new type of reporting. 2018/19 will be implemented BC wide.
- ii. Letter grades will not be included on report cards except for summative (year end) for Grades 4 9 (as per parent request).
- iii. 3 major changes: Shift from summative to formative assessment, 5 required communications with parents within a school year, Student self-assessment of the Core Competencies.

b. Learning Grant

- i. Government to provide \$32 per student (based on last year's enrollment approx \$4500). School has until end of January to spend the grant funds.
- ii. There is a Student Learning Grant process (steps a g).
- iii. Main idea is to defer costs for parents.
- iv. Eligible expenditures: athletic equipment, fine arts and music supplies, electronic learning resources, resources to assist non-enrolling teachers etc.

c. Rainy Days

- i. Safety is the #1 priority.
- ii. K 2 will be in Music Room (games/music/colouring/books). Grades 3 4 in library (books/homework etc). Grades 5 7 in gym (board games/cards/homework). Also an outside option (under covered area) unless weather is inclement terrible. All areas supervised.

d. Diversity

- i. Are parents still interested in having someone to come into a PAC meeting to present/discuss Diversity?
- ii. Also an option to connect with a second PAC to share cost and explore other topics i.e. anxiety

e. Updates

- i. Social Learning/Responsibility Ms. Trovao will be trying to use assemblie and activities to introduce these topics
- ii. FSA next week Grades 4 and 7
- iii. MDI Middle Years Survey (connectedness, school experiences, health and wellbeing etc are topics). How do we support vulnerable students in our district are more resources need in certain areas.
- iv. No after school programs set up right now. Use to be initiated by Templeton. Depends on staffing.
- v. Grade 3 swimming on-going as long as it is offered.

Addendum (PAC Agenda OCT 18th, 2017): Proposed Constitution Changes (Jordan)



- 1. All funds of the organization will be on deposit in a bank of financial establishment registered under the *Bank Act*. With the exception of the petty cash fund and the float fund.
- 2. The petty cash fund shall be a maximum of \$300.00.
- 3. The float fund shall be a maximum of \$150.00.
- 4. All money spent above and beyond the predetermined amount of \$75.00 will first be presented to and voted on by the executive and then approved by a majority at a general meeting.
- 5. Any expenditure of \$75.00 or less that must be made in between general meetings shall be presented to all the voting members in attendance at the previous general meeting by e-mail. A majority vote will signify approval of the expense.
- 6. The Executive shall name at least three signing officers, one of whom will be the treasurer and one of whom will be a non-executive voting member, for banking and legal documents. Two signatures will be required for these documents.
- 7. A Treasurer's Report to all members should be published in the PAC meeting minutes prior to the end of each school term.
- 8. A need for audits will be agreed upon by the members at any general meeting where upon an independent auditor will be appointed as needed.

Proposed Changes in Bold - SECTION XII FINANCES

- 1. All funds of the organization will be on deposit in a bank of financial establishment registered under the *Bank Act*. With the exception of the petty cash fund and the float fund.
- 2. The petty cash fund shall be a maximum of \$300.00.
- 3. The float fund shall be a maximum of \$100.00.
- 4. All money spent above and beyond the predetermined amount of \$100.00 will first be presented to and voted on by the executive and then approved by a majority at a general meeting.
- 5. Any expenditure of \$100.00 or less that must be made in between general meetings shall be presented to all the voting members in attendance at the previous general meeting by e-mail. A majority vote will signify approval of the expense.
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- 8. A need for audits will be agreed upon by the members at any general meeting where upon an independent auditor will be appointed as needed.
- 9. The financial year of the Council will be September 1 to August 31st.



10. Power to Raise Money - The Council

may raise and spend money to further its purposes.

11. The executive will prepare a budget and present it to the membership for approval before the current budget expires.
